

Frank Olivieri the great nephew of the Pat Olivieri the founder of the Philly Cheesesteak Sandwich will tell us the history of how his great uncle who owned a modest hot dog stand now Pat's King of Steaks Restaurant in South Philadelphia in 1930 created the cheesesteak sandwich.

Frank will discuss his family history and how his uncle's cheesesteak sandwich has become synonymous with the Philly Cheesesteak as we

know it today.

SHANE CONFECTIONARY AMERICAS OLDEST CANDY STORE

We will learn how Shane Confectionery which was established in 1863 in downtown Philadelphia has survived for a century and a half. Year after year, customers line up at Christmas time and Easter to purchase from Shane's Mabel Brown who was known for crafting the best candies. The Shane name was always known to be trustworthy and reliable even as the world was changing drastically around them. While other candy companies had submitted to the easier path of using pre-made formulas or manufacturing candies with robot technology.

Shane Confectionary has insisted that all their candies be hand-crafted.

YUENGLING AMERICA'S OLDEST BREWERY

The Yuengling Brewery was established in 1829 in Pottsville, Pennsylvania. The D.G. Yuengling & Son, Inc. brewery is now owned and operated by Richard (Dick) Yuengling, Jr. who is the fifth- generation owner. Dick's four daughters and sixth generation, Wendy Yuengling, Jennifer Yuengling, Debbie Yuengling Ferhat, and Sheryl Yuengling are all members of the Yuengling staff. We will learn how the brewery has survived since 1829 as a family brewery while many other US breweries have not.
