

Washington State University Extension: Addressing Total Farmer Health®

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Agriculture is known to be both a difficult and dangerous occupation. Washington State University Skagit County Extension recognizes there are various dimensions of Total Farmer Health, including physical, mental, emotional, and social, and seeks to address related needs through three programs. The Washington State AgrAbility Project (WSAP) supports farmers with injuries and ailments in adopting tools, techniques and equipment to return to work safely. The Western Regional Agricultural Stress Assistance Program (WRASAP) identifies the stress management resources available for farmers, ranchers, and farmworkers and seeks to reduce stigma around behavioral health concerns in rural communities. Additionally, the WSU Agricultural Suicide Prevention Pilot Program provides education on the farmer health crisis, suicide risk factors and warning signs, and evidence-based suicide prevention approaches.

Washington State AgrAbility Project

Objectives:

- Offer worksite assessment for injured farmers
- Build Assistive Technology Lending Library Kits for distribution throughout state
- Offer low-interest loans and financial training (Northwest Access Fund)
- Establish a web-based Pathway to Services network

Western Regional Agricultural Stress Assistance Program

Objectives:

- Establish a clearinghouse of resources available to farmers which address various stressors in farming
- Offer Question, Persuade, Refer (QPR) suicide prevention trainings
- Explore ways to reduce stigma around behavioral health concerns in agricultural communities


Washington State Agricultural Suicide Prevention Pilot Program
